#### **VTA**

This product uses mirrors on its exterior, providing an appealing aesthetic, and give the effect that a room is bigger than it actually is, and has symmetrical detailing. This would not be suitable for my client however, as the mirrors would require constant cleaning, limiting the designs practicality.

### Sustainability

This product would not be very sustainable as it heavily features metal and glass, which both have large carbon footprints and would likely have high distribution distances. This would not be suitable for my client, who has requested the product to be as sustainable as possible

# **Materials**

This design makes use of a metal frame, which provides a strong, durable and rigid structure for the product to be built upon. Wood was used for the interior of the product, which has a lower density than metal, and therefore less weight, making it ideal for moving components such as the drawers. The exterior of the design however is covered in glass mirrors. This would not work for my client as glass is easy to shatter and scratch, and the client has requested for the product to be durable and hardy, which glass is not

# Sustainability

This product was made with locally and responsibly sourced wood, reducing its carbon footprint, and lowering it distribution distances. This would suit my user, who has asked for the product to be as sustainable as possible.



This design uses a more rustic, natural style, evident through its use of wood and blackened metal. The design remains modern though, with symmetric details, with sharp lines and muted colours. This would suit the user who has requested a modern influenced design




# Sustainability

I also don't like the gap between the drawers and the outer walls, and the drawers are really hard to open. Once open though, I do like the size of them, they are massive, which is great.







#### UCD

This design is purpose built for the user, a tv editor, with space for three monitors, and a seperate, lower section for the keyboard and mouse, promoting better posture, comfort and ergonomics. This design shows how my product can be tailored to my user

#### **VTA**

The design of this table is mainly black, with orange detailing highlighting the edges and various changes of line angle throughout the product. This would suit my user as it adds a unique touch to the design

#### **Materials**

This product has been made with a metal frame, which provides strength and durability to the design, whilst the table tops have been made from manufactured board, which helps to comparatively reduce the weight of the product, compared to other design options. This would suit my user who has stated that the product will be moved around guite often, and should be strong yet relatively lightweight

#### VTA

This product uses naturally finished wooden planks for the table top, being light brown in colour. It is a basic rectangle shape, contrasting against the weathered grey deck, painted house, and white cushions on the chairs. This would suit my user as it has a modern, clean design, which he has requested.



# Sustainability

This product was made from responsibly sourced wood, however it was not locally sourced, This product was made with a frame causing the product to have a high distribution distance, not suitable for my user who would like his product to be as sustainable as possible

#### UCD

This design allows for easy access to and from the table, and the table itself is at a good height for eating, showing that anthropometric have been used. This suits my user as it is practical for it designated task

# **VTA**



# **VTA**

This design has an unusual, unique feel, as it has been made from a once living animal. This is a unique idea, and would provide the user with a product that literally no one has, or will ever have, as no two sheep are the same. The wool also provides a warm, soft texture, perfect for the bedroom environment

# **VTA**

This product features a unique design, inspired by a stack of books. This mixes curves with sharp lines, and a cool white colour to provide an unusual, appealing, modern design, which makes a statement, without being too brash about it, a potential inspiration that suites my users requirements


# **User comment:**




# **VTA**

The design is made from a smooth textured plastic, with a semi-shiny finish, and a round glass top. The use of these materials gives a modern design, with the black belt breaking up the design. This design could be used as inspiration for my user as it provides a unique perspective on potential table designs.




#### **VTA**

# Purpose, Function & Context

In keeping with the context of its environment, with sake and bamboo sitting on it, the design has remain functional whilst also representing Japanese culture in a new way. This would suit my client as it provides inspiration on new ways to tie in culture to the product design



# **PFC**

This table design has a layered design, with plenty of storage space. The top section rotates so that it nacelle and fan blade of a repurposed jet can be used as a seperate table or desk, and rotates back to line up with the rest of the unit. This allows it to occupy less space when being used, which is a good secondary function idea that could be used for my users product.



#### VTA

This product design feature a very modern, minimalistic Scandinavian design. The white upper section contrasts against the dark matte wood of the base, with a glass table mid section separating the two. My client has asked for the product to have a Scandinavian influenced design, and this product provides an example of that through its muted colour palette, matte finished wood, and sharp lines and edges

#### **Materials**

This design makes use of the forward engine. This provides the table with a high degree of strength and durability. Glass have it the property of transparency allows the design to always be on display. This would suit my user as it provides a unique combination of material properties

# Sustainability

This product features a more sustainable design as it has up-cycled an existing product that would've otherwise been sent to scrap, greatly extending its lifecycle, reducing its overall impact on the environment. This would work for my user as he has requested for his product to make use of sustainable design




#### **VTA**

This stool design provides amazing visual, using dyed natural branches, suspended in a clear acrylic, almost as if they are floating. The acrylic used in the design provides a clear finish, so the user can see the branches within. The acrylic provides a depth bending effect, whilst providing a strong, durable stool. This style would suit my user as it provides a unique design, without removing from the products usability

This design makes use of an interesting element, removing the more traditional flowers that would be the centrepiece of the table, and replacing it with grass. The green contrasts well again the wood of the table, and looks soft and aesthetically pleasing, contrasting with the hardness of the table. #### UCD

The design of the table incorporates both the unique design of the table, with the grass centre, whilst maintaining practicality for the user, which plenty of table space. This would suit my user, who has requested unique design, and needs table space




#### Sustainability

#### **VTA**



# Innovation & Creativity




#### **User Comments:**

# **Planned Use and Storage**


The user is looking to replace the school provided bedside table with a more functional one, specifically one with a designated space for his subwoofer, which he can take home when he finishes school.



This is the clients room in the boarding house, with the bedside table being designed going where the old one is, with the aim being to have a more tailored and practical design, whilst also improving upon the design and style of the existing product

The shape of the room is square, being 3200mm x 3200mm, which is reflected in other areas of the room such as the drawers under the desk, the rectangular desk, square cubby holes above the desk, and rectangular bed and cupboards.

The existing product is a suitable size for the user, and works well in the space available, providing enough space and room for more traditional bedside table use, with the new product providing on display storage for the sub as well. The dimensions for the existing bedside table are: 680mm high, 500mm deep, and 500mm wide






The draws under the desk protrude into the space that could be used by the drawers, with the full width being 1.58 metres, however when the drawers are open they limit the usable width to 1.12 metres



There are also drawers under the bed, which the new table can't block. They mean that the new table cannot be more than 76 cm deep.

The bedside table needs to be roughly the same height as the bed, in order to ensure ease and comfort of use, particularly in a low light setting. The height of the users bed is 70 cm The existing bedside table the client has includes a lockable drawer at the top of the product, which is also lockable. The client has stated that he would like the new design to feature a drawer, and has also communicated that he wouldn't mind if the drawer was a little bigger than it currently is. The size of the existing draw is also square, being 370mm x 370 mm





Another downside of the sub being under the desk is that it isn't visible to most, and it has been designed to look good, which it does

Due to the lack of storage and space available, the sub is currently located under the desk in the corner. This impacts leg room, and is also not ideal for sound, as the walls and cupboards reflect the sound, leaving areas of the room bass heavy, and some lacking bass

The sub is finished in a gloss white, with matte black detailing in and around the centre hole, where the dual drivers are located

feet in each corner, which lift it off the ground slightly. The feet also have a rubber layer on the base, which stop the bottom of the sub getting scratched, and stop it sliding around during use

The sub design of the sub is based on a rectangle, with a cut out in the middle for air and sound from the drivers to escape. The dimensions for the sub are 389mm high x 402mm wide x 159mm deep. It weighs 16kg

The base of the sub also has




reasonable flexible, as it can automatically switch between 100-240 volts, and between 50-60 Hz AC



The user's room makes huge use of emerging technologies. There are smart lights above and on the desk, powered by Google Assistant, which is on the Google Home Max next to the lights above the desk.

The design should make use of smart features to fit into the room, and integrate it into the user's existing product ecosystem

The light brands used are LIFX and Philips Hue, so if lighted are incorporated into the table, they should be by those brands, so that everything connects seamlessly



The user also lives with dogs, and has four younger siblings, so the design should be rather sturdy and strong, to withstand any excessive forces applied, ie. hit by a ball etc.

Because of those around the product, it should also be easy to disassemble and fix, should something happen, improving the sustainable design part of the product
